As of this Church Conference, I am serving in my 10th year as the Lead Pastor at the Sun Prairie United Methodist Church. It is a blessing and privilege to continue to serve alongside the people of SPUMC. The ministry we share is guided by the ministry of Jesus and is a witness to God's love, grace and purpose in our lives.

I am thankful for the staff ministry we share and the dedication of our staff to the individual ministries to which they are called that serve our church and Beyond Our Doors. I feel blessed to walk this journey of faith together and to serve as your lead pastor.

When you read through our Litany of Gratitude that offers a snapshot of what we have done in ministry together in 2024, you will be inspired. The ways we continue to share of ourselves in relationship with God as the body of Christ in our community and the world is a blessing!

PASTOR OF YOUTH & YOUNG ADULTS

I have enjoyed another year at Sun Prairie United Methodist Church serving at children, youth and young adults. I particularly appreciate SPUMC's understanding when I asked to step away from children's ministry to focus more on my family and my health.

It has been a great year for youth and young adult ministry at Sun Prairie United Methodist Church. I continue to be blessed with amazing adult volunteers who help to make youth ministries possible. Sunday night Youth Group, Sunday School and Club 3,4,5 all are doing well. We now regularly see grades 6 through 12 at our weekly programs.

Over the summer we enjoyed campfire games, traveled on a mission trip to Niagara Falls, New York, went on a retreat to Lake Lucerne Camp and spent a day at Mount Olympus Waterpark and Amusement Park in the Dells. We had 26 youth volunteer as VBS mentors this year.

We have seen youth step into leadership roles this year such as teaching Sunday School, leading VBS stations/groups and attending Annual Conference as a Youth Delegate. I am looking forward to seeing the ways in which our youth will continue to grow as leaders within our church.

Youth Ministry is looking forward to a renewed commitment to serve with several new service opportunities scheduled for this upcoming year. Returning opportunities such as shopping for Spirit of Giving gifts, preparing a meal for the Crossing Campus Ministry, handing out candy with Hall-O-Ween and hiding Eggs for our Community Egg Hunt will continue. As well as new opportunities such as our Fall and Spring Rent-a-Youth and shopping for the Northside Food Bags. We also have already started to plan and fundraise for our 2025 Mission Trip with Youthworks Missions next summer.

Two of our most popular young adult ministry programs continued this year. Last January, we gave 17 college students a small gift card to enjoy as they started their semester. This year SPUMC disbursed 16 scholarships to college students within our church community.

It has been a pleasure to spend time with the wonderful youth and young adults at Sun Prairie UMC and I cannot wait to see God continue to work through the young people of our church.

DIRECTOR OF CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES

During my brief time as Director of Children's Ministry, I had the pleasure of creating vibrant and engaging experiences for the young hearts in our community. Park Pals was a cornerstone of our summer program, where we utilized events organized by the park district to blend faith and fun seamlessly. We participated in Community-Wide celebrations like Juneteenth and Pride Fest. Our season culminated in the hugely popular Taylor Swift Era's Tribute Concert, where kids sang and danced to their favorite hits. In the fall, we introduced our new name, Kid's JAM (Jesus & Me), and logo.

I reformatted our weekly newsletter to be more eye-catching and easily read. We hosted HALL-o-ween, an indoor trick-or-treating extravaganza that brought festive excitement to life. Our weekly Wednesday Children's Ministry sessions, Circuit, provided consistent spiritual growth and fellowship opportunities.

I also amended the Sunday School schedule to have all the classes kick off in musical worship together. Speaking of Sunday School, we have two youths teaching our 3rd-5th Grade class for the first time ever. Everyone is overjoyed with how well they are doing and how much the students enjoy class. So far, Kid's JAM has been a time filled with joy, learning, and lasting memories for the kids and their families.

DIRECTOR OF CONNECTING MINISTRIES

Connecting Ministries has had another busy year! We have over 150 – ushers, greeters, welcome center hosts and fellowship time hosts continue to try to make people feel welcome at SPUMC.

We have worked at making our Fellowship Time be a place where people can chat with old friends, make new friends and see a welcoming person giving them coffee, hot chocolate or tea and a donut. We have worked hard at getting enough fellowship time teams to only serve quarterly. People have enjoyed seeing our youth serving, having taken on some Sundays.

Last December we had our 4th Live Nativity. This is one of SPUMC's signature ministries, with many people coming from the community, as well as our church family to enjoy hot chocolate and listening to carolers, while driving around to see 6 different scenes from the Christmas story. We had 447 people and dogs drive through and 174 volunteer spots filled. Since this has become a rather large production, we have added many coordinator roles to help this all run smoothly.

This year we had a confirmation class again, with the plan being every other year now. This year we had a Confirmation Class of 19 students and 22 mentors and met on Wednesday evenings for dinner and class. We are blessed to have so many adults support our youth in this way and make a commitment to attending every Wednesday with them. We were able to raise money from our Sunrise Service offering to purchase food for the Patrick Marsh Food Pantry. We had a special collection on Confirmation Sunday to purchase fidgets and items for the Horizon Guidance Department in memory of our mentor, Ali Armstrong.

Our Greenspace Committee has made great strides in creating a "Memories Garden" to make the space between the church and the Wesley House a beautiful place to do ministry and have fellowship. We had a group of 11 of us working on this and hired a landscape architect to help us come up with a beautiful plan that we presented to the congregation on Fathers Day. We kicked off our fundraising efforts on Rally Day in September to offer the chance for people to purchase an engraved paver, bench or trees towards the garden. Avant Landscaping will plant some of the trees in November to start off the project.

We had another successful Rally Day with around 100 people and a "Fall Kickoff" theme. We were able to be outside and had lunch, did some mission projects, had a booth to help people learn about ways to get connected into the life of the church, games for both adults and kids and many children's activities, along with a Sunday School Open House.

All in all, it was a great year to support each other as we strive to help others and grow in our faith at SPUMC!

DIRECTOR OF TECHNOLOGY & ONLINE COMMUNICATION

I am now in my third year of serving in this role at Sun Prairie UMC. I am continued to be blessed by this church's support as we grow our technology and online ministries. We are a church that is both online and in person. People are connecting with us in so many different ways for worship and to grow their faith.

Here are some highlights from my ministry area in 2024:

- 1. We continue to have a large number of people worshiping with us online. We are seeing a slight increase of the number of worshippers who join us "live' at 8:30 am. We continue to see people joining us online as well outside of our normal worship time.
- 2. We continue to transform our flexible seating in the sanctuary and even tried tables and chairs during Lent.
- 3. We use multiple tools for communication across our website, emails, and social media to engage with our congregation.
- 4. We have completed some upgrade work to the "nuts and bolts" of our worship tech area in the back of our sanctuary.

In addition to overseeing tech and online ministries, I am in my third year serving as the staff liaison to our Reconciling Ministries Team here at church. This year Reconciling participated in the second Sun Prairie PRIDE fest. We also continue to explore what it means to truly welcome and love all of God's people. This group has focused on social justice issues in 2024 including race, election support, moving beyond our doors through advocacy, and the changes around LGBTQ issues at our 2024 General Conference.

I also began working as the staff liaison to the Outreach Team this summer. I am so impressed by the many ways our church supports missions locally, nationally, and internationally. In 2025 I am hoping to learn more about all of the amazing work this team does.

DIRECTOR OF CARING MINISTRIES

Here is a snapshot of the caring ministries that we offer at the Sun Prairie United Methodist Church.

Visitations

An important part of my ministry is the opportunity and joy of visiting church family members who are typically in their aging years. In my visits it's my hope to bring them the love of God, along with the love of our church family.

Community Worship Services

Currently, I provide monthly worship services at the Talamore and Hyland Park retirement communities. During our worship time, I offer prayer, scripture, a meditation, communion, along with hymn singing. Services are held on the second Thursday of each month. We worship at Talamore at 11:00 am and at Hyland Park at 1:00 pm.

Xtra Years of Zest

XYZ is monthly gathering of seniors for a time of fellowship and dessert, followed by a program of some kind. Recent programs include a presentation from the Sun Prairie City Planner and a presentation from the Sun Prairie Historical Society. In addition to church family members, we often have a number of guests. We meet on the third Wednesday of each month, September – May. We begin at 1:00 with dessert and fellowship, followed by our program of the month.

Pastor Brad's Broadside

One way that I've tried to keep our older members connected is through a newsletter that I periodically send out. I call it "Pastor Brad's Broadside" and it includes a short thought/essay from me, along with highlights of news happening around the church.

Meal Ministry

There are times in life when meals at home become a temporary problem. Examples include when there has been a hospital stay or the arrival of a new baby or a death in a family. When a difficult situation arises, we are ready to help by providing gift cards or gift certificates to a local restaurant. A call to the church office by an individual, family member or a friend will get the ball rolling. The program is supported in part by generous gifts from our church family.
